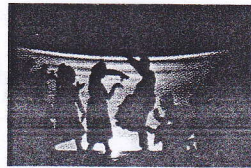


1 Look at the pictures and use them to complete the text.

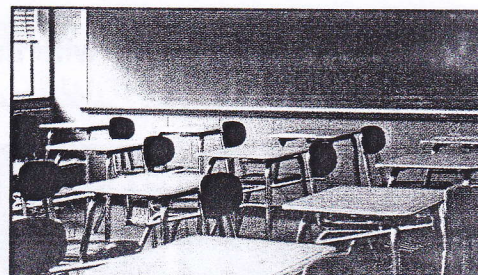
